

CATALYST CLEMENTE MIDLAND

A COMMUNITY EDUCATION PROGRAM DELIVERED BY ECU IN PARTNERSHIP WITH FOUNDATION HOUSING

Catalyst Clemente teaches university courses in the arts and humanities in a community setting.

Clemente students undertake one unit per semester, taking a total of four units over a period of two years.

Upon successful completion of Clemente, students receive a University Certificate in Humanities and Arts – which enables entry into a relevant ECU Bachelor's degree.

Am I eligible to take part?

Clemente is designed for people who have not had the opportunity to complete higher education in the past due to challenges in their life – including financial constraints, health and social issues, and other factors. No formal qualifications are required for course entry. Instead, to undertake Clemente, you must be 18 years of age or older, have a willingness to commit to a 12 week program and have a literacy level that is sufficient to read a newspaper.

What does the course involve?

Clemente teaches a range of arts and humanities subjects depending on which unit is offered each semester.

Students learn critical thinking, communication and writing skills, research skills, and reading and interpreting texts.

How much does it cost?

Catalyst Clemente is completely free to Australian citizens.
