The CORT Column

The Committee of Residents and Tenants (CORT) meet regularly to discuss policy and provide feedback on a range of issues that impact tenants and residents.

Three CORT meetings have been held so far and several topics have been covered such as our Tenant Liability policy and how charges are calculated, engagement activities and communication with tenants. The key items discussed at the June meeting and how Foundation Housing intends to respond are as follows:

Customer Service Charter

A Customer Service Charter project plan was presented to the CORT. There was discussion about how to engage tenants and residents in the drafting of the new charter. Foundation Housing will develop a communications plan and will invite tenants and residents to participate in a focus group to discuss what good service looks like and what could be included in the new Charter.

Regional representation

The CORT discussed how to increase representation in Perth and secure representatives in regional areas.

Website Redesign

The CORT was provided an overview of the website redesign project about to start and members agreed it would be good for all tenants to have an opportunity to input into the new design and content plan. There is an article in this newsletter encouraging tenants to give their feedback on the current website.



Climate Change

The CORT was given an overview of Environmental Social Governance (ESG) which is an area the community housing sector is actively investigating. The CORT discussed how tenants should be engaged on this issue and it was agreed that an information session on ESG will be included in the upcoming Roadshows. Further information will also be included in future newsletters as it becomes available.

Policy Communication

The CORT recommended that communications be developed on Tenant Liability and Anti-Social Behaviour policies. Information has now been included in the new tenant handbooks sent out in late June and will hold information sessions on each policy at the September Roadshows.

Meeting agendas are co-designed by the Chairperson, Deputy Chairperson and FHL Senior Management two weeks prior to the scheduled meeting.

Helping out tenants during their Covid-19 isolation

The state border opening in March meant that a lot of tenants and residents had to undergo isolation either as close contacts or from contracting the COVID-19 virus.

Since then, our Community Engagement Team have been in contact with isolating tenants to do a wellbeing check-in and respond to their needs, whether that be grocery delivery or help to access their medical supplies.

"By offering a helping hand, I hope tenants feel less stressed about being in isolation," said Tiffany (Community Engagement Officer) who has managed these wellbeing checks.

Jessica and her three children living in Bassendean were one of many tenants who received some assistance.

"I was really grateful to receive some groceries. It was hard being isolated. The help from FHL really took some pressure off," said Jessica.

Pilbara Update

Celebrating our one-year partnership in Hedland with Bloodwood Tree!

In December 2020, the Department of Communities engaged Foundation Housing and Bloodwood Tree Association to deliver the Hedland Aboriginal Home Ownership Program (HAHOP).

The program aims to increase independence and improve wellbeing for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families, while supporting them on a pathway towards home ownership if that is their goal.

Foundation Housing is currently managing 27 tenants in the program, and we are excited that, as of June 2022, nine of those tenants have celebrated their anniversary in their homes. Leeanne Day, a tenant since June 2021, will soon be leaving (as she has purchased her very first home). She has kindly shared her story with us.

Leanne's Story

Whilst living in a private rental, Leeanne tragically lost her partner in 2020 and had to seek emergency housing. Her friends were quick to suggest that she apply for the HAHOP. With her application fast tracked due to her situation, Leeanne was moved into a Foundation Housing home within a month.

"I have been so lucky to be in this program, I don't know where I would be without it. The house I have been living in is so homely and has been perfect for my situation. Foundation Housing and Bloodwood Tree have been so supportive of my journey and my goal to buy a home. I am still pinching myself because it doesn't seem real," said Leeanne.

When asked what advice she would give to others with similar goals, she said: "You must give it a go and believe in yourself. You have one life, so make the most of it."

Planning on a happier future: Fiona's Story

Fiona first became a tenant with Foundation Housing in 2013, at our Fremantle lodge. She wanted to move away from negative people in her life, so was excited to start her life of independence.

Tired of ongoing knee pain and not being able to do the things she used to, Fiona knew that she had to improve her lifestyle for a healthier and happier future.

Three years later, we were able to move Fiona to our brand-new Bennett Street Lodge, close to the hustle and bustle of East Perth. Flourishing in her new home, Fiona said she still felt like something was holding her back, her weight.


"I was very excited to move to Bennett Street, but I knew that my health was in jeopardy and if I was going to do anything about it, it had to be now," she said.

With access to local agencies and through the support of the Lodging team, Fiona decided to take the first steps and receive counselling about options to manage her weight. Her health situation was assessed, and she was told that surgery might be an option for her, but first she had to lose some weight herself to prove that she was committed to making healthier life choices.

"I was ready to lose weight. I was determined because I knew that if I didn't put one foot in front of the other and give this my best go, I wasn't going to live a full life," she said.

"I went into surgery in November 2021 and since then, I have lost 54kg. My friends can hardly recognise me. I am so happy that I pushed myself to lose weight. I can do

things I never used to be able to do, like going for a walk around the block. I wouldn't have much of a future if I didn't get support from the people around me, like Foundation Housing," said Fiona.

When asked what advice she would give other people who wanted to kickstart their health journey, she said:

"If I can do it, anybody can do it. You must be confident in yourself and put your mind to it, no matter what obstacles you are facing. Create habits for yourself that are realistic and seek a support network to have your back."

Congratulations on your achievements, Fiona! It has been wonderful to see your progress over the last few years and see you able to get out and about in the local community.

A \$400 electricity payment for our Lodging and shared

residents is on the way!

In May, the State Government announced a oneoff \$400 Household Electricity Credit to help reduce the cost-of-living pressures for households, as part of the 2022-23 State Budget.

Eligible recipients of the payment include those in apartment buildings or homes where electricity costs are recouped from tenants by the owners (such as strata management). It also applies to households that receive electricity charges direct from a retailer other than Synergy or Horizon Power, such as Perth Energy or Alinta Sales.

We are pleased to announce that our Lodging

Residents and eligible tenants will be receiving this credit and will be notified by their Lodging or Housing Coordinator who will also help in completing the required application.

If you are billed by Synergy or Horizon Power, please contact your provider directly to discuss your eligibility.

Please note, only residents signed up on or before 12 May 2022 are eligible for the payment.

Get Studying with our Scholarship Program!

Thinking about studying but not sure you can afford it?

Applications are now being accepted for Foundation Housing's 2023 Scholarship program. There are two scholarships, each providing funding of up to \$2000 which can be used for fees or expenses of your chosen course.

The purpose of the scholarship is to assist people undertake education or training to enhance their employment opportunities or develop skills. These could be TAFE or university courses, or other vocational training including online learning. One of the scholarships is specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander tenants.

Applications will be assessed against the eligibility criteria, commitment to engage in study and evidence of how the funds will help you reach your education and employment goals.

Applications close 27 November 2022.

Karlup.

Our Broome office meeting room was renamed **the 'Jila' room** and the meeting room in our South Hedland office was renamed **the 'Ngurra' room.**

An update on housing upgrades!

The Social Housing Economic Recovery Package (SHERP) Grants Program is a State Government initiative that provides funding for new and upgraded community housing.

Earlier this year, we received approval for refurbishment works for a grant totalling over \$1.7 million. Over the last two months, property refurbishments have been completed and have included repaints and flooring replacements.



Currently, works are being undertaken at complexes, including Wright St, Highgate, Ammanford Crescent, Butler, and Ladera Drive, Clarkson. These works include external painting, fence installation and structural repairs. The following projects are forecast for the next two months:

Solar Installation

For 23 properties, including 6 lodging properties. Over \$100,000 worth of solar panels to be installed.

Swan River Lodge

Rear balcony decking replacement and office refurbishment. Scheduled for August.

Foundry Rd, Midland

Security upgrades, including a new car park vehicle gate.

Kutcharo Crescent, Joondalup

Property refurbishment. Expected to commence at the end of August.

Inspection Reminders

- Ensure all exhaust fans and sliding door tracks are cleaned
- Wipe marks from walls, doors and windows
- Clean and scrub showers including the grout
- Clean light switches and light covers
